In my work, I use a lot of bold, saturated and vibrant colours with the use of skin tones and ordinary shades. When creating woodcuts, I tend to create a diverse kind of mark-making to create textures and bring a sense of life to a flat sheet of wood. My style is a mix of surrealism and illustration. I enjoy creating pieces with realistic elements while bringing a sense of wonderment through illustrative qualities and colour. My practice is very open, but I enjoy creating figure painting with lots of colour. I create these pieces mainly on canvas with acrylic or oil paint. Although, I am trying to incorporate these figure with the other mediums I use such as printmaking, watercolours and coloured pencils.

Growing up, I would always people watch and observe the people going around me. Looking for the shapes and different colours that I can see in figures that pass around me. Being a dancer for most of my life, gave me the chance to see many different figures in different poses. Figures and portraits were always a harder subject for me conceptually and artistically. Continuously practicing them was my way of pushing myself in my art and which gave me the most satisfaction at the end. I enjoy taking figure comparisons in a literal sense to comment on how we view and talk about bodies.
